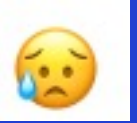


To our Darling Padrinos & Madrinas:

FABULOUS toilet facility for our school – including a system for keeping it clean!

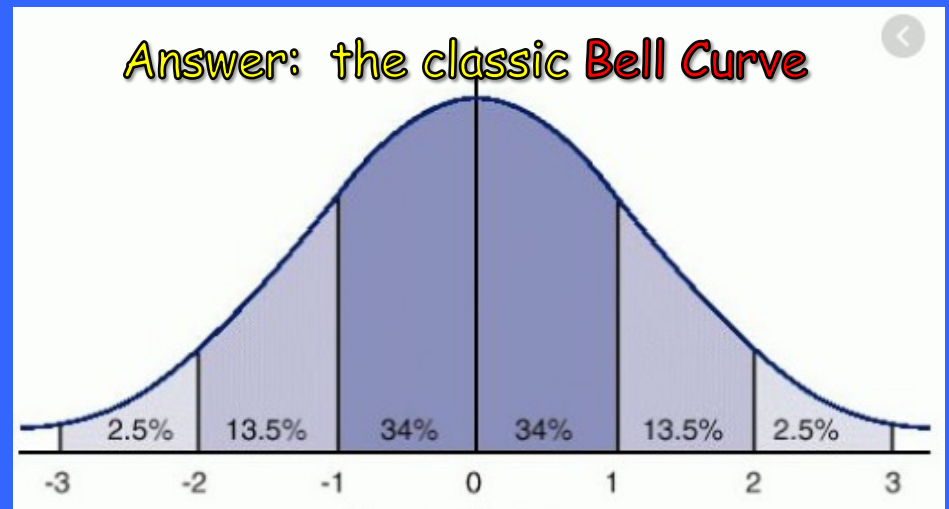


But what about my passion - EDUCATION...
